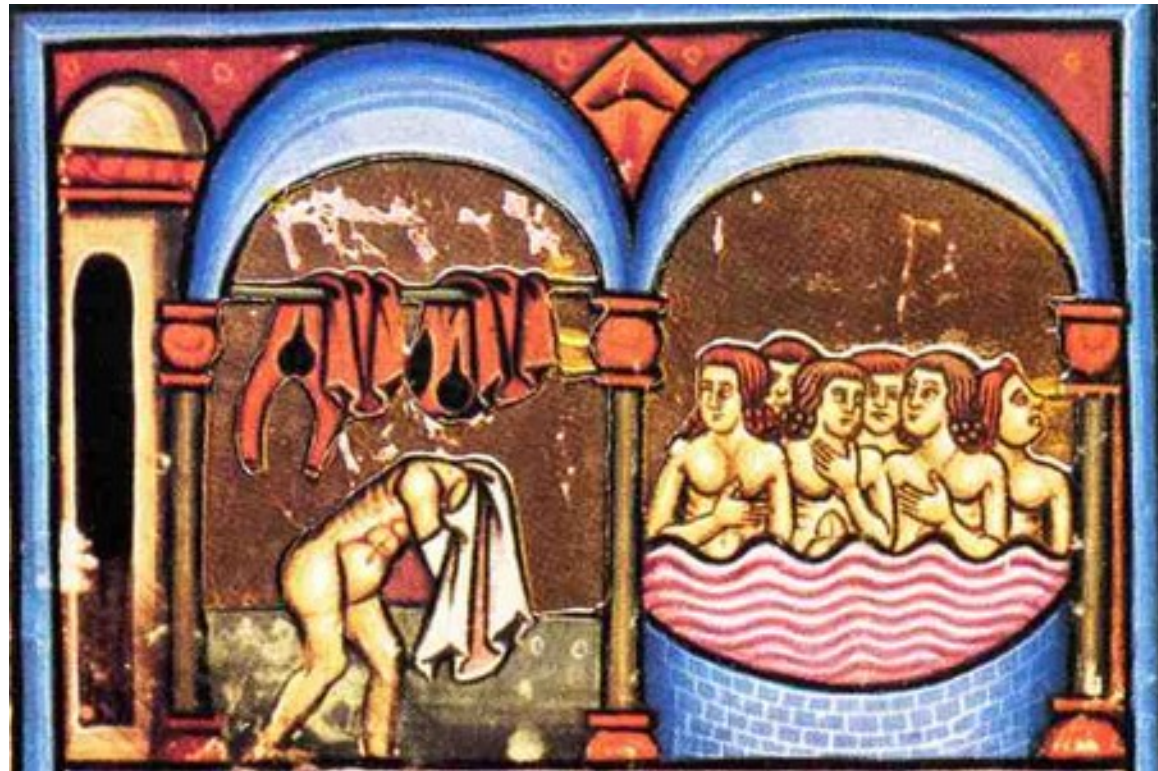

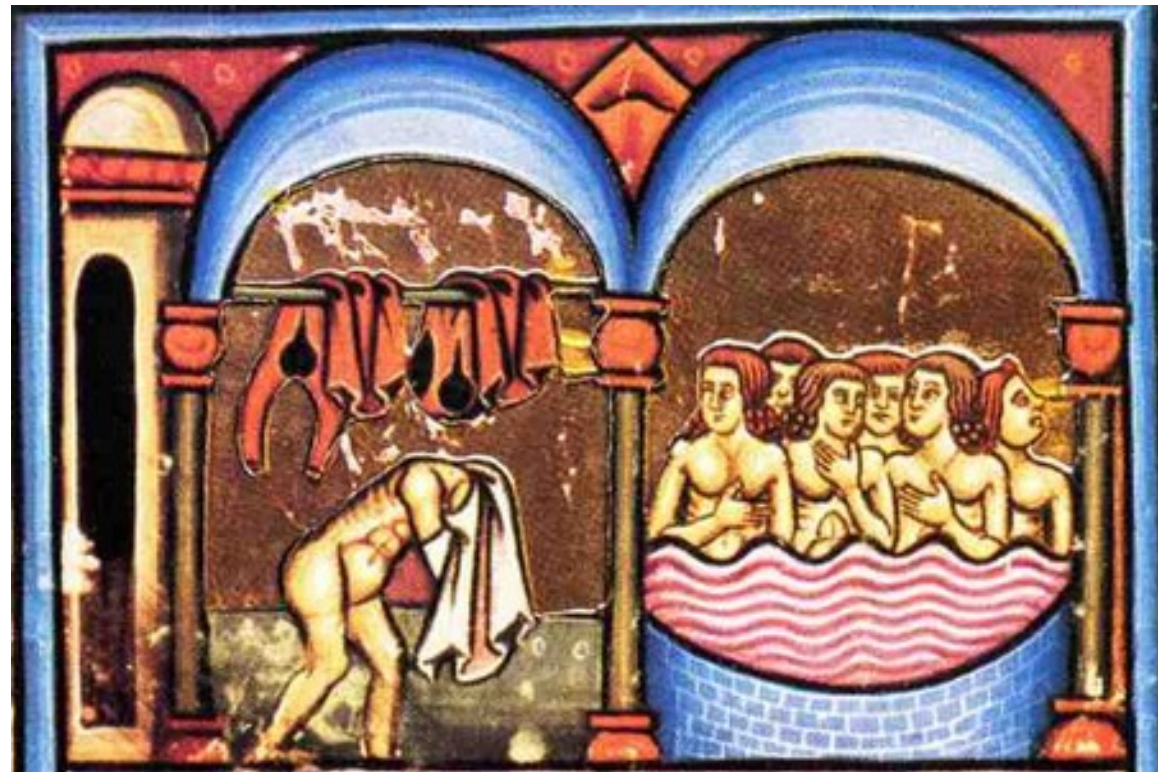

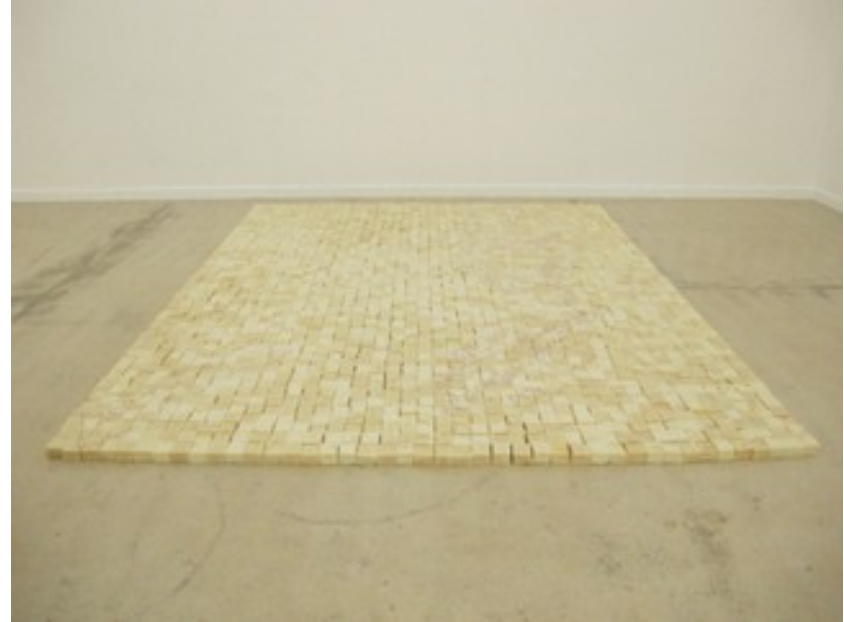

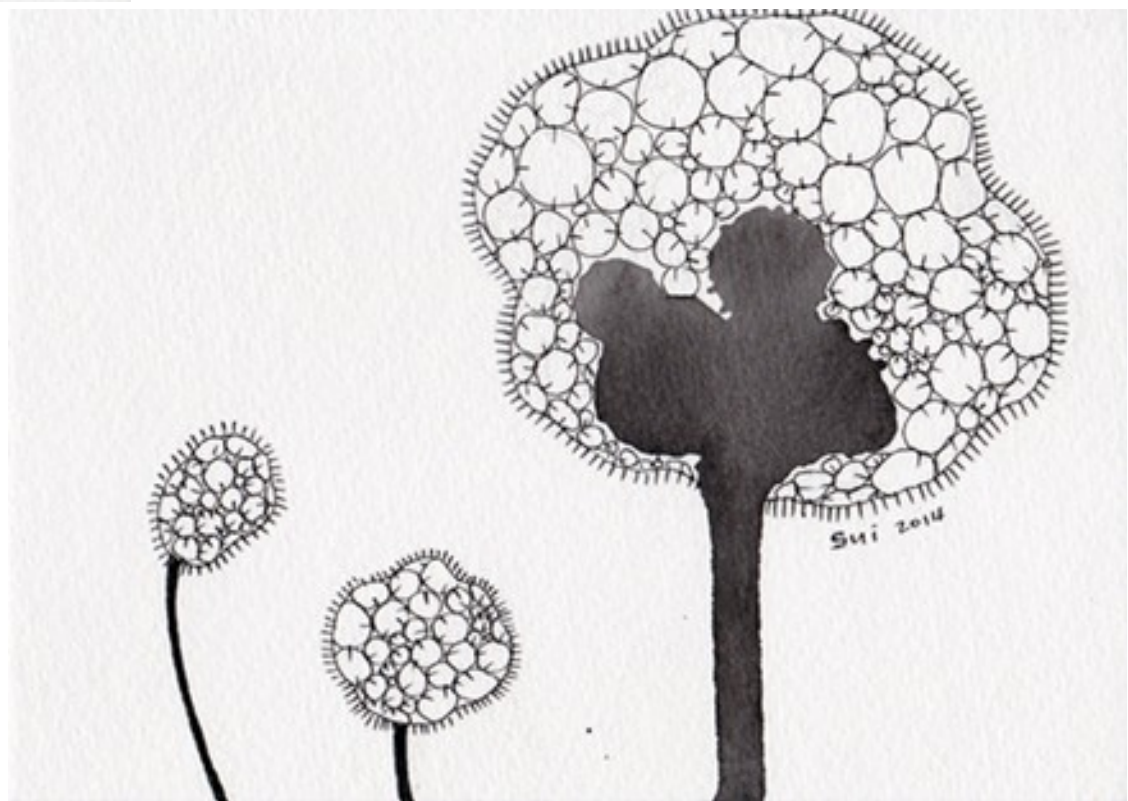
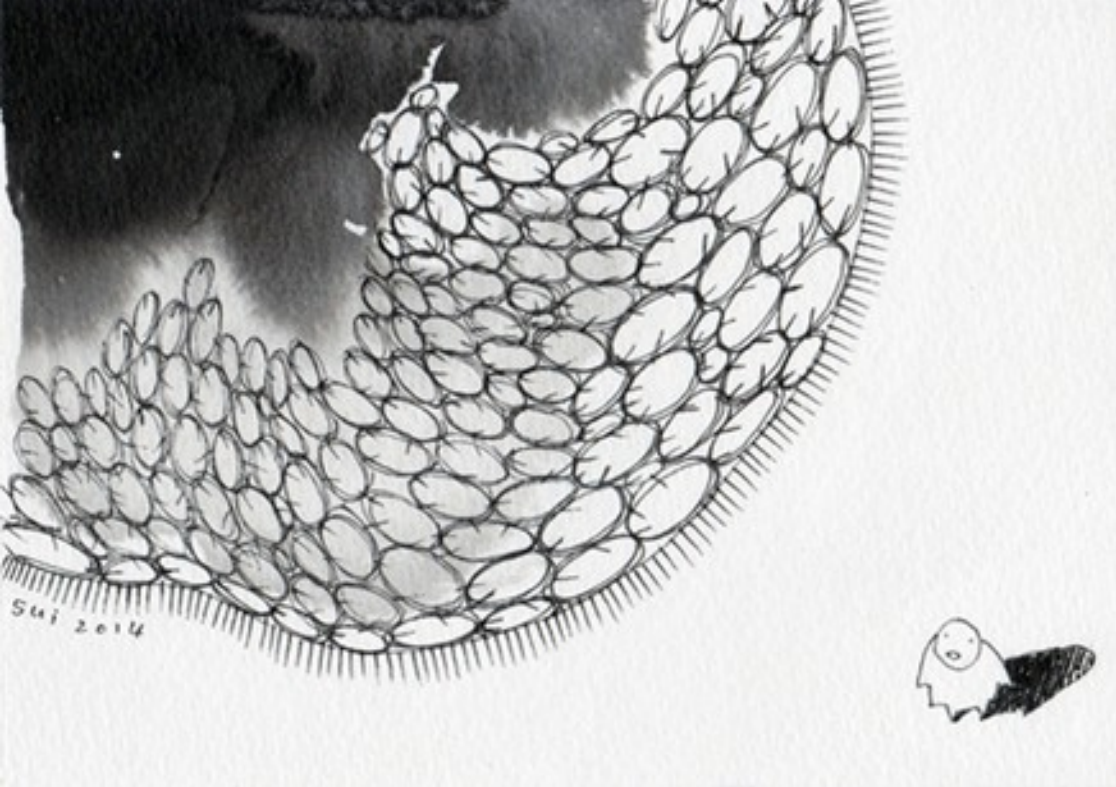


**Broom** (brūm), *n.* [OE. *brōm* (from WGer. *\*brōma-*), pointing to OTeut. *\*brōma-*: cogn. with BRAMBLE.] 1. A shrub, *Sarothamnus* or *Cytisus Scoparius* (N.O. *Leguminosae*), bearing yellow papilionaceous flowers. Also the genus to which this belongs, and the allied genus *Genista*, including the White Broom, and Giant or Irish Broom, etc. 2. Any one of various other plants used for sweeping, or fancied to be akin to the broom proper; as BUTCHER'S BROOM, SPANISH BROOM, *q. v.* 3. Any implement for sweeping, a besom; orig. one made of twigs of broom, heather, etc., fixed to a handle. Cf. BESOM *s. v.* ME. Also *fig.* and *transf.*

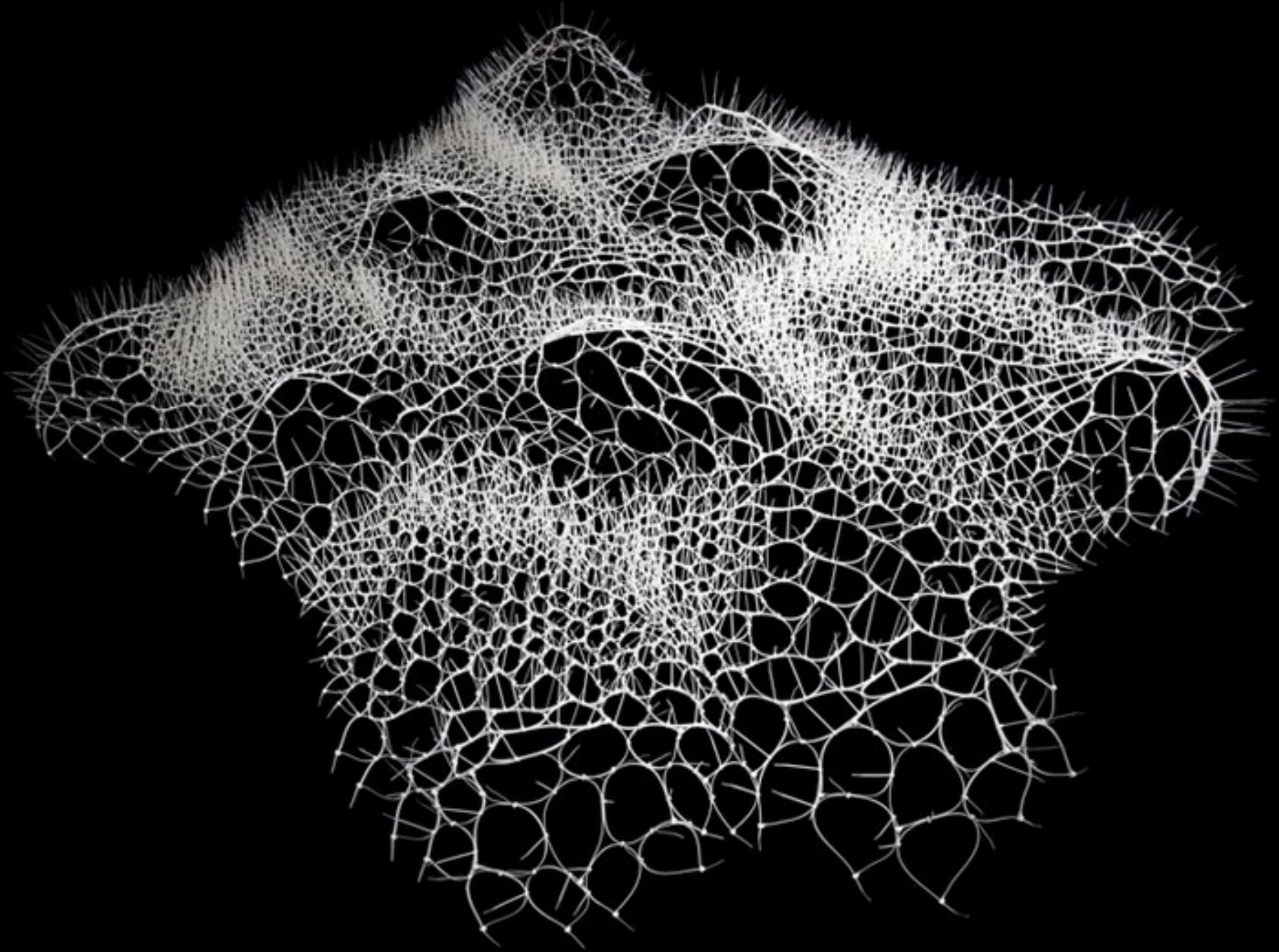
